Policies & District Information

CHECKredi Process for Collection of Returned Checks - Saline Area Schools collects payments from families and the community in a variety of ways, one of which is payment by check. We recognize that occasionally a parent or community member may inadvertently overdraw a checking account and a check may be returned by your bank. In order to recover these funds in a private and professional manner, we have contracted with CHECKredi, LLC, a company based in Lexington, Kentucky, for collection of returned checks. When a check is written and made payable to the district, the person writing the check agrees that, if the check is returned that it may be represented electronically on the same account, and that the fee established by law, now \$25.00 in addition to the face value, may be debited from the same account. If not collected within the initial 7 days the fee will increase to \$35.00. (Please note that all checks should include name, address and telephone number.) CHECKredi will contact you by mail and by telephone in order to make arrangements to pay before attempting to represent the check electronically. Payments may be made to CHECKredi's office by mail to P.O. Box 11848, Lexington, KY 40578. Payments of the check and fee may also be made online at www.checkredi.com using a credit card, debit card or electronic check without any additional fees. For a convenience fee, payments may be made over the telephone at (800) 239-1222 by credit card, debit card or electronic check.
